How Does an Artist Get Into Wildlife Art Magazine?

Thank you for your interest in *Wildlife Art*. As you can well imagine, we receive many requests from artists who would like their work published in the magazine.

Unfortunately, we do not have the space to feature everyone who contacts us, and **we do not have the staff to personally respond to all inquiries**. Therefore, even though you do not receive a response from us, please be assured that we will keep your information on file for future consideration. Meanwhile, we offer several ways to have your artwork considered for publication in the magazine.

WHAT'S NEW — ORIGINALS

What's New showcases original artwork by a number of artists. Due to the quantity of submissions, *Wildlife Art* limits each artist to one appearance a year in What's New.

Instructions for What's New Originals:

Submit an image of your original painting or sculpture with the title of the piece, the medium, the dimensions and price. Include your name, city, state, phone, Web site or e-mail address and gallery information.

Image Specs for What's New Originals:

We can accept a publication-quality slide or transparency; or a high-resolution 300 dpi digital image that is approximately 4x6 inches on a CD disk. Send it to: What's New Originals, c/o A. Kupers, 7503 Arbor Lane, Savage, MN 55378. Or you can e-mail a 300 dpi digital image (JPG, EPS, TIF, or PDF) to waedit@wildlifeartmag.com along with the submission materials.

NOTE: Incomplete submissions may not be used.

NATURE'S WAY

This section consists of your image of an endangered or threatened species and a brief description (approximately 350-400 words), written by you, of the animal's characteristics, habits and habitat. Be sure to relate any personal experience you may have had with the creature you've depicted. We welcome your suggestions of an appropriate species; however, we cannot use the following animals

because they have appeared in recent issues: wolf, cheetah, bobcat, bonobo ape, and zebras. Submission instructions are the same as for What's New, except address your submission to Nature's Way. Include your name, address, phone, the title, medium and dimensions of the image, and an image of yourself, preferably taken with an animal like the one depicted in your art. Be sure to tell us in writing where the picture was taken and include a few words about what's going on in the picture.
